2006 SPRING/SUMMER SEASON TEAM INFORMATION PACKET

The BC Baseball League, in its 13th year, is an organization of coach-picked teams playing USSSA Baseball with most of its games scheduled in Columbia at the Twin Oaks Sports Complex and some games in Jefferson City at Washington Park and, potentially, other locations. Teams and players in this league come from all over Central Missouri, but mostly from Boone, Cole, Callaway and Audrain counties.

The purpose of the BC Baseball League is to organize and promote youth baseball, to perpetuate the interest and the love of the game and to provide an opportunity for teams to compete in baseball at a higher level. The affiliation with USSSA Baseball provides an opportunity for league members to qualify for state and national championship play. The league members qualify as teams, not as end-of-the-season all-star squads, for this post-season play. During the 2005 Spring/Summer season, 34 of the 39 teams in the BC Baseball League summer program qualified for state tournament play and 12 of those teams went on to national level play.

For the 2006 Spring/Summer Season, league will offer divisions/games in the following age groups: 14 & Under, 13 & Under, 12 & Under, 11 & Under, 10 & Under, 9 & Under and 8 & Under Player Pitch. New for the 2006 season will be individual age group scheduling (with very few crossover games vs. the younger/older age group, providing there are enough teams for each age group) and individual age group championships.

Games for the 11 & Under through 14 & Under divisions will begin in the first week of April (the week of April 3-7) while starting date for games in the 8 & Under through 10 & Under will be set in January. Typically, these age groups start later than the older age groups.

2006 SPRING/SUMMER SEASON INFORMATION

14 & Under and 13 & Under Divisions: Teams will play in separate age groups with no crossover games vs. the older/younger teams, provided there are enough teams. Teams will be scheduled for a total of 20-22 games. Teams will play on fields set with 80-foot base and 54-foot pitching distances. Portable mounds will be used for games in these age groups. Games will be seven innings in length and will be played with a 1 hour, 45 minute time limit. Game times will be 6PM and 8:10 PM with teams playing mostly doubleheaders. This division will begin play in the first week of April. Players in these age groups will be allowed to wear metal cleats. USSSA Baseball rules are used for these divisions. **2006 League Fee: \$1,700 per team.**

12 & Under and 11 & Under Divisions: Teams will play in separate age groups with no or a very limited number of crossover games vs. the older/younger teams, provided there are enough teams. Teams will be scheduled for a total of 20-22 games. Teams will play on fields set with 70-foot base and 50-foot pitching distances. Portable mounds will be used for games in these age groups. Games will be six innings in length and will be played with a 1 hour, 45 minute time limit. Game times will be 6PM and 8:10 PM with teams playing mostly doubleheaders. This division will begin play in the first week of April. Players in these age groups will NOT be allowed to wear metal cleats. USSSA Baseball rules are used for these divisions. **2006 League Fee: \$1,700 per team.**

10 & Under and 9 & Under Divisions: Teams will play in a separate age groups (provided there are enough teams) with limited crossover games vs. the older/younger teams. Teams will be scheduled for a total of 14-16 games. Teams will play on fields set with 65-foot base and 46-foot pitching distances. Portable mounds will be used for games in these age groups. Games will be six innings in length and will be played with a 1 hour, 45 minute time limit. Game times will be 6PM and 8:10 PM with teams having an option to play mostly doubleheaders or mostly single games. This division may begin play in the first week of April, although the actual starting date will be determined in January. Players in these age groups will NOT be allowed to wear metal cleats. USSSA Baseball rules are used for these divisions. At these age groups, player pitching and full stealing rules are in effect, although there is a large amount of leniency concerning balk rules with the pitchers. The rules of this division also provide for a continuous batting order. **2005 League Fee: \$1,485 per team.**

8 & Under Player Pitch Division: The rules for the 8 & Under Player Pitch Division are the same as other divisions, with the exception of no leadoffs and no advancing on passed balls or dropped/missed third strikes. Teams will play on fields set with 60-foot base and 40-foot pitching distances. The rules of this division provide for a continuous batting order (everyone is in the batting order, even though they may not be playing defense at that time). Games will be six innings in length and will be played with a 1 hour, 30 minute time limit. This division will play a 12-game season and one league-sponsored tournament (May 12-14, 2005). Game times will be 6PM and 8:10 PM with teams having an option to play mostly doubleheaders or mostly single games. This division will begin play the first week of May, following a four-week pitching clinic for all coaches and players. Players in these age groups will NOT be allowed to wear metal cleats. USSSA Baseball rules are used for these divisions. This division will provide for team and/or individual player signup. **Approximate League Fee: \$1,100 per team or \$100 per individual for individual signup.**

2005 Fall League Successful; Plans to Hold League Again

During the Fall of 2005, the BC Baseball League ran its Fall Season on Sundays. Fall Season play was held in five age groups (14U, 13U, 12U, 10U, 18U High School and 16U High School). The Fall Season, for the first time, started with a Fall Pre-Season tournament. A total of 24 teams registered to play. Plans are being made now for the league to run a Fall League in 2006, with the Fall Pre-Season Tournament scheduled for August 25-27, 2006. Games will be played at Twin Oaks (Columbia) for age groups 14U and below and at local city and/or high school fields in Columbia and/or Jefferson City for the 18U High School and 16U High School Divisions.

USSSA Age Eligibility & Classification

In past years, The BC Baseball League has followed the age rules utilized for the Missouri-Kansas region of the USSSA in determining age eligibility. The Missouri-Kansas region of the USSSA utilized an age-based system for Major and AAA teams and a grade-based system for AA and A teams.

With the change in USSSA rules of determining a player's age group based on their age as of April 30 of the season, the Missouri-Kansas region of the USSSA will adhere to the USSSA rules for all classifications. ***The BC Baseball League will follow these same rules for determining ages for league teams.*** Thus, all teams in every classification must meet the USSSA rule book rule which determines a player's age group by the player's age on April 30 of the season. (ex: A player who turns 11 on February 21 will be 11 on April 30; thus, that player's age group is 11 and Under.) Players are allowed to play up, but not down.

In classifying teams, the strength of a team determines the team's classification. This classification is done by the USSSA state office in Kansas City. Thus, a team registering AA could be moved up to AAA and a team registering AAA could be moved up to Major. Teams are allowed to petition to have classifications changed; however, this petition must go through the USSSA state office.

Volunteer Time

Teams in the BC Baseball League are required to provide a certain number of volunteer hours to assist the league. Modeling its system after those used by leagues in the St. Louis and Kansas City area, the BC Baseball League instituted a Work Deposit Fee, which is refunded once a teams volunteer hours are worked.

During the 2005 season, teams were allowed to provide a person or persons to work 24 hours at one or more of the league's 5 work days in efforts to continue to renovate the Twin Oaks Complex. In order to make sure people showed up, teams were required to pay a Work Deposit of \$300. Teams also could buy out of the volunteer hours by paying this Work Deposit and requesting they not be scheduled, thus forfeiting their fee. Also, all teams were required to provide serving assistance in the Twin Oaks Concession Stand one or two times during league games.

For the 2006 season, the Work Deposit Fee again will be \$300. The BC Baseball League Board of Directors again will review usage of these volunteer hours by team at work days (only 3 in 2006), in the concession stand or at tournaments. This information will be finalized and announced at the January Coaches Meeting.

2006 BC Baseball League Pre-Season Tournament Thursday through Sunday, March 30-April 2, 2006

Tournament To Be Open To Non-League Teams for 2006

The BC Baseball League will host its second Pre-Season Tournament in 2006, although it will alter the format to allow for non-league teams to enter the tournament (although the number will be limited to entries needed to even out age groups).

This tournament will be played on Thursday, March 30, 2006 through Sunday, April 2, 2006, with the actual start date to be determined once entries are received. The tournament will be a USSSA State Qualifier for all levels - Major, AAA and AA, with state berths available for all three classifications

This tournament will consist of three pool games and then bracket play. Last year, this tournament replaced the league's Post-Season Tournament. An entry fee of \$285 and a gate fee of \$165 will be charged to non-league teams. Participating league teams will pay only the entry fee and no gate fee to play in this tournament.

This tournament will serve as a kick-off to the 2006 BC Baseball League's 13th Season.

In the 2006 BC Baseball League Tournament, all participating league teams will play together in one tournament - AA, AAA and Major at the league kicks its season off with a tournament to see what's happened since the previous year! Also, teams will be able to accrue BC Interstate 70 Series points and participation by playing in this tournament (see below for more information).



I-70 Series Includes 20 BC Baseball events in Columbia, St. Louis and Sedalia

BC Baseball has revised the I-70 Series to include only its tournaments, which for the 2006 Spring/Summer season will consist of 20 different events in Columbia, St. Louis and Sedalia. Also, the 2006 tournament schedule may not be complete as several tournaments may yet be added (in the St. Louis area). In addition, BC Baseball will run two July tournaments and three Fall tournaments (although these tournaments will not be part of the I-70 Series).

This series is an opportunity for teams which play BC Baseball tournament to earn points towards a prize package would could include a paid entry fee to the team's USSSA World Series, State Tournament or merchandise. Complete details will be announced at the January Coaches Meeting and on the BC Baseball web site (www.bcbaseball.org).

Teams again will be required to play three BC Baseball tournaments to be eligible for the prize package in the series. Standings for the I-70 Series will be updated weekly on the BC Baseball website.
